

#### Methodology

This Counterpolling<sup>™</sup> survey of 955 Registered Voters in Florida was conducted online for AFPI on May 27-June 2, 2023. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the state's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population. Except where noted, results are from the sample of Registered Voters.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 3.2 percentage points.
