As South Dakota's first female governor, she was re-elected in 2022 with the largest vote total in state history, championing limited government, fiscal responsibility, and state sovereignty. Noem set a national precedent by deploying National Guard troops to the southern border five times and leading South Dakota to become the first state legislature to support border defense through a formal resolution. She has been a leader in countering foreign threats, restricting business with adversarial nations, and prohibiting agricultural land ownership by hostile countries. Under her leadership, South Dakota became a national hub for

cybersecurity, with the industry now the state's fastest-growing sector. As the next Secretary of Homeland Security, Noem will bring her proven record of innovation, resilience, and security-focused governance to the national stage.

Deployed National Guard troops to the southern border five times in four years to protect American citizens from an unprecedented surge in illegal migration. Received a nearly perfect score from the Federation for American Immigration Reform for her votes on immigration-related bills while in Congress.

Protecting Americans from Adversarial Foreign Nations:

Banned TikTok for state government employees and blocked state government employees from doing business with adversarial foreign governments.

Promoting Effective Disaster Response:

Worked with FEMA to <u>protect farmers</u> and other Americans from the devastating effects of natural disasters in her home state.

Streamlining Government and Cutting Red Tape:

Signed a series of bills to streamline state government by reducing red tape, reducing government overreach, and simplifying regulations.
