Pete Hegseth, a former military officer, author, and Fox News host, combines a distinguished record of service and advocacy with a passion for public discourse. Born and raised in Forest Lake, Minnesota, he graduated as valedictorian of his high school class before earning a degree in politics from Princeton University and a Master of Public Policy from Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government. Serving as a Major in the Minnesota Army National Guard, Hegseth completed tours in Iraq, Afghanistan, and Guantanamo Bay, earning two Bronze Stars for his service. His experiences in the military led him to become a vocal advocate for service members and veterans. After honorably completing his military service, Hegseth led organizations such as Vets for Freedom and Concerned Veterans for America, in which

he was a leading national voice in the effort to promote conservative values in service members and veterans' affairs. A published author, Hegseth has written In the Arena: Good Citizens, a Great Republic, and How One Speech Can Reinvigorate America (2016), American Crusade: Our Fight to Stay Free (2020), and The War on Warriors: Behind the Betrayal of the men Who Keep Us Free (2024), contributing to the national conversation on freedom and security.

Advocacy for Veterans' Rights

Spearheaded key initiatives as the executive director of a prominent veterans' organization to reform the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). These efforts included advocating for landmark legislative reforms, such as the Veterans Choice Act, which expanded healthcare options by allowing veterans to seek care outside the VA system when needed. Additionally, efforts were made to increase accountability within the VA, pushing for better oversight of its operations to ensure efficiency and responsiveness to the needs of veterans.

The initiatives prioritized improving mental health services and addressing critical issues like the high rates of veteran suicide and post-traumatic stress disorder. Under this leadership, a comprehensive approach to veteran care was championed, encompassing medical treatment, job training, and community reintegration. These contributions significantly enhanced the overall quality of services and access to care for millions of veterans across the United States.
