FATHERLESSNESS IN SOUTH DAKOTA

Fatherhood is foundational to strong families, and strong families are essential to a strong Nation. An absent father affects all aspects of a child's life, from socio-cognitive and socio-emotional development to academic performance and criminality—and unfortunately, the effects of fatherlessness are visible in South Dakota.

FATHERLESSNESS IN THE UNITED STATES

- Approximately 18.4 million <u>children in the U.S.</u> live without a biological father, stepfather, or adoptive father present in the home.
- 23% of children in the U.S. are raised by a single parent. This is more than three times the world average (7%) of <u>children raised by a single parent</u> and the highest rate of any country on Earth.
- Approximately 41% of children are <u>born to unwed mothers</u>. For women under age 30, the unwed birth rate increases to 53%.
- Fathers are <u>absent in approximately</u> 80% of single-parent homes.
- Fatherless children are more likely to suffer from psychosocial development issues, live in poverty, drop out of school, engage in school violence, abuse substances, and enter the juvenile justice system.

FATHERHOOD AND FAMILY IN SOUTH DAKOTA

- 57,000 South Dakota <u>children</u> live in single-parent households, representing 29% of all South Dakota children.
- There were 3,951 births to <u>unmarried women</u> in South Dakota in 2020, 36% of all births that year.
- There are about 533 teen births in South Dakota per year.
- There were 1,683 children in <u>foster care</u> in South Dakota as of 2020.
- 40,620 <u>children</u> have one or more emotional, behavioral, or developmental conditions in South Dakota or 23% of all South Dakota children.
- About 3,000 teens ages 12–17 have <u>abused</u> alcohol or drugs in the past year in South Dakota.

EDUCATIONAL OUTCOMES IN SOUTH DAKOTA

- 64% of South Dakota 4th-graders <u>scored</u> "below proficient" in reading for their class level.
- 61% of South Dakota 8th-graders <u>scored</u> "below proficient" in mathematics for their class level.
- 16% of South Dakota <u>high school students</u> do not graduate on time.
- On average, South Dakota spends about \$10,049 per <u>student</u> in public schools.

PUBLIC ASSISTANCE IN SOUTH DAKOTA

- 35,799 households receive <u>SNAP benefits</u> in South Dakota.
- 15,397 infants and children are <u>receiving</u> WIC benefits in South Dakota.
- There are approximately 31,584 South Dakota children living in <u>poverty</u>, which is about 14.9% of all South Dakota children.
