

TOP ISSUES FOR CALIFORNIANS

CALIFORNIANS BELIEVE EXCESSIVE TAXES AND REGULATIONS ARE DRIVING AWAY BUSINESSES.

- 70% say that the state should cut spending, considering the decline in revenue attributed to California businesses leaving the state. Only 13% support raising taxes.
- 63% think California's taxes and regulations hurt the state and make remaining businesses consider moving elsewhere.

HOMELESSNESS AND CRIME ARE TOP OF MIND FOR CALIFORNIANS.

- 74% say crime is the most important issue facing Californians.
- 67% of Californians consider homelessness "very important".

• 78% do not want to pay even \$10 a month more for electricity to move to renewable sources, and 35% do not want to pay anything extra.

• 59% view improving education as "important" while 32% see it as "somewhat important".
