** Do you approve or disapprove of the performance of President Joe Biden?*

Methodology

The survey of 800 Registered Voters was conducted by Scott Rasmussen using a mixed mode approach on December 27-28, 2021. Field work was provided by RMG Research, Inc. Most respondents were contacted online or via text. However, 216 were contacted using automated phone techniques. Respondents were selected from a list of Registered Voters and through a process of Random Digital Engagement. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the state's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 3.5 percentage points.
